She volunteered at the Friendship Center Clinic, played bridge and friendly card games, and enjoyed going to the movie theater. She was lighthearted and optimistic, and as her life story unfolded, she maintained her sense of humor through it all.

A devout Catholic, Phyllis renewed her soul and her strength by attending daily Mass. Above all, her children and grandchildren made her so happy, and in the autumn of life, having family by her side was all she needed.
