Mrs. Agnes (Vedete) Juidiciani, age 84, formerly of Rutger St., Utica, and more recently of New Hartford, passed away on Friday, December 12, 2008 at the Charles T. Sitrin Healthcare Center.

Born in Utica on December 3, 1924, Agnes was the youngest of 7 siblings born to the late Louis and Angela (Montemurro) Vedete. She was raised and educated locally.
