Although she was never able to speak verbally, she communicated in her own language. She comforted people with her soulful smile, peaceful persona, and loving "Lexy-isms." She was an inspiration to all who were a part of her life. To her siblings, Lexy was always the "big sister" and "Pooh Bear," an endearing nickname evoked from her affection for Winnie-the-Pooh and her collection of stuffed animals that surrounded her with softness and security. Lexy was a twin and was able to communicate with her twin sister Loretta through their own special bond. Her brother Philip entertained her with hugs and kisses and untold whispers in her ears. Her sister Erica was her 'sense of reason' and a dependable caregiver. Her grandmother "Ma" Rose truly knew her as one of the joys of her life, and uncles Bobby and Richie shared many special moments. She also conveyed her thoughts and feelings to her caregivers and extended family in her own unique ways. But it was her interactions with her mommy, who was her greatest source of comfort, and her daddy, who consoled and connected to her while dancing with her and holding her over his shoulder, that truly

cheered and enriched her life. Everyone in this blessed family was so proud of their Lexy; she was an integral part of each day's activities and was always surrounded by her loved ones. As a child, Alexis attended the United Cerebral Palsy Association in Barneveld and thereafter was enrolled in home schooling. When her sister Erica graduated in 2006, Alexis was bestowed an honorable mention. When she was able to, Lexy ate anything sweet, from cotton candy to chocolate pudding or frosting which was among her favorites. Her laughter and smiles were thrilling and exciting. Lexy blessed each day with an "Amazing Grace" for all who walked beside her on her path of life. Alexis is survived by her devoted parents, Philip and Mary Elena; her siblings, twin sister Loretta Ann Sinnott and fiancé David Plescia; brother Philip Sinnott II and Mary Ann Talento; and her sister Erica N. Sinnott. Alexis was unconditionally loved and cared for by her maternal grandmother, Rose "Ma" DeSantis.
