



## Alfred S. Carbone, Sr.

May 4, 1917 - October 12, 2006

Mr. Alfred S. Carbone, Sr., age 89, of Utica, passed away unexpectedly on Thursday, October 12, 2006, in the comfort of his home with his loving family by his side. Born in Utica on May 4, 1917, Alfred was the son of the late Joseph and Maria Theresa (Gelfuso) Carbone. Raised and educated in Utica, he was proud to be a member of the Conservation Corps. On February 27, 1943 he married the former Mary E. Rozonkiewicz. The couple shared a loving and dedicated union of 63 years. They were inseparable.

Alfred was a self-employed professional painter and for many years he was honored to work alongside his son, Al. A good, loving husband, father, grandfather, and great-grandfather, his love revolved around his family. He shared a special relationship with each of his children, and they always admired the way their Dad adored and treated their Mom. He was ever supportive of his family and humanitarian to anyone in need. Blessed with physical and mental strength, Alfred enjoyed gardening and maintaining the homestead. He especially enjoyed the time spent with his loved ones camping and fishing at the family camp at White Lake. A very spiritual man, he would invite those he loved to share in praying the daily rosary. He was a faithful parishioner of St. Anthony of Padua Church, and he was proud of his status as Noble Knight in the Knights of St. John, Commandery #385, and the Nocturnal Adoration Society.

Mr. Carbone is survived by his wife, Mary E.; his daughters and a son-in-law, Katherine and Thomas Bronk; and Theresa Carbone, all of Utica; and his

sons and daughters-in-law, Alfred "Al" S. Carbone, Jr. of Cold Brook, NY and Jacqueline of Utica, and Joseph "Joe" and Mary Carbone of Glendale, AZ. He was blessed with the relationship that he shared with Eddie and Carmella Nassimos of Frankfort, whom he considered a son and daughter-in-law; also very dear and close friends, Lee Wheeler and her son, Shawn.
