Mrs. Angeline E. "Angie" (Percola) Fellone, age 91, of Canastota, and formerly of Utica, passed away on Sunday, November 20, 2011 at the Masonic Care Community of NY.

Born in Utica on July 13, 1920, Angeline was the daughter of the late Nicholas and Catherine Percola. She was raised and educated locally. On April 30, 1949 she married Anthony P. Fellone with whom she shared 27 years prior to his passing on November 30, 1976. A woman of strength and grace, she was happy in her marriage and counted her blessings, and was a woman of her time.
