Mrs. Angeline "Angie" (Tomaino) Leone, age 81, of Utica, passed away on Monday, November 29, 2010 with the love and support of her family by her side.

Born in Utica on May 18, 1929, Angeline was the daughter of the late Anthony "Tony" and Catherine (Gigliotti) Tomaino. Raised and educated locally, she was a graduate of T.R. Proctor High School. On September 4, 1948 she married Joseph A. Leone who passed away on August 12, 1985; it was their love and devotion that blessed and secured their 37 years of marriage.

Angie was employed by the Head Start Program, and later worked for UNIVAC for several years. She subsequently worked for the Utica City School District in the food service department, the position from which she retired.

Angie will be remembered as an extrovert and one who 'walked along' those who needed love and support. She had a generous spirit, a happy nature, and a sparkling sense of humor with infectious laughter. She stood for what was right and just, and was always optimistic.
