



## Angeline C. (Coriale) Motto

Mrs. Angeline C. (Coriale) Motto, age 89, currently of Stuart, Florida and formerly of Albany St., Utica, passed away on Saturday, May 5, 2007, at Martin Memorial Hospital South after a brief illness.
