September 11, 1930 - September 10, 2007

Mr. Angelo Saporito, age 76, of Clinton, NY, passed away on Monday, September 10, 2007 in the comfort of his home with his loving family by his side.

Born in the province of Messina, Sicily, Italy on September 11, 1930, Angelo was the son of the late Paolo and Rosa (Panzarotto) Saporito. He was raised and educated in Sicily, and served with the Italian Army. On April 12, 1958 in Italy, he married the former Marianna Rovereto with whom he shared a loving and devoted union of 49 years. The couple came to the United States and eventually to New Hartford where they have since resided.

Angelo was a knitting mill mechanic, retiring from Waterville Knitting Mills after many years of loyal and conscientious service. A self-taught man, he was innately knowledgeable and handy. Loving, caring, and deeply devoted, Angelo was a wonderful husband and father, always there for his children. His family was the focal point of his existence. He also shared a very special relationship with his siblings, treasuring memories of many special occasions. He enjoyed gardening and raising magnificent fig trees. 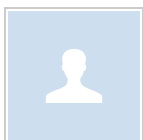
