Mrs. Anna "Aunt Ne" (Bonarrigo) Garcea, age 86, a longtime Utican, passed away on Saturday, January 12, 2008 at the Presbyterian Home for CNY, Inc. Born in Utica on August 21, 1921, Anna was the daughter of the late Nicola and Antonina (LoPiccolo) Bonarrigo. Raised and educated in Utica, she graduated from T. R. Proctor High School as a member of the class of 1939. On November 16, 1946 she married Enrico L. "Rico" Garcea with whom she shared a loving and devoted 36 year union prior to his passing on May 12, 1983.

Anna began her career as an assembler with the Bendix Corporation and subsequently worked in a similar capacity for the General Electric Company. Next she was employed in an office position at Griffiss Air Force Base for a period of time; she then became a bookkeeper with the New York State Department of Transportation, the position from which she retired in 1987 after more than 23 years of loyal service.
