



Mr. Anthony J. Carzo

February 8, 1931 - March 15, 2024

UTICA – Mr. Anthony J. Carzo, age 93, decided to go home to the Lord, on Friday, March 15, 2024, with dignity and serenity. At the time of his passing his loving wife, children, and grandchildren were beside him.

Born in Utica on February 8, 1931, Anthony was the fifth child of the late Frank, Sr., and Anna (Aurigema) Carzo. He attended Conkling Elementary School and was a graduate of T.R. Proctor High School/Class of 1949. Tony served his country with honor in the U.S. Army during the Korean War, where he was assigned as a company clerk. He spent his deployment stationed in Germany and traveled throughout Europe. Upon returning to Utica, he embarked on a new chapter of his life.

Tony enrolled at Mohawk Valley Technical Institute (MVCC) as a full-time student majoring in business, while working evenings at Chicago Pneumatic. Upon graduating, he began a career in real estate, was the proprietor of the Dilly Wagon, and acted as a consultant of Dun and Bradstreet. In 1965, he began commuting to New York City to study to become a stockbroker. He had a passion for his chosen field and excelled in his profession. At several times during Tony's career he was a respected manager at Bache, Loeb Rhoades & Co., and Shearson, where he formed a partnership with Andrew Bevivino and David Scharf. Tony was a trusted advisor and confidentiality was a priority, this was the secret to his success. He eventually retired from Morgan Stanley in

2007.

Tony and the former Carol Julian were married on September 11, 1965 at St. John the Evangelist Church, New Hartford, NY. Together, they built a life filled with mutual respect, support, and true love, surrounded by family and a wonderful group of friends. They had a fulfilled life through their 58 years of marriage which was infused with much fun, laughter, and cherished memories.

Tony had a spirited personality and delighted in doing anything charitable and kind. His siblings were his best friends. Tony and his family gathered for all the holidays, and family events, no matter the location – family came first, and he wanted everyone to be there. He especially enjoyed Tuesday lunches with his brothers.

As a father, Tony was always present to the needs of his children from their youth to their adulthood. He offered support and wisdom, making his presence known to encourage them to pursue all that life had to offer. When the grandchildren came, the rules changed, and his inner child emerged. He never missed any of their events. He made a lasting impression and had such a special relationship with each of them. Tony was creative and intelligent, with a quiet heart. His grandchildren took the lead from their Poppie's advice, and they were always amazed by the events in his 93 years of life.

Tony was a member of the American Legion Fort Schuyler Post, the Italian Heritage Club of the Mohawk Valley, and a lifetime member of the Elks club. He was an avid golfer and enjoyed bowling and playing bocce with his brothers.

Tony came from humble beginnings, and he never forgot that Morris St. was where it all began. Family and friendships were his main priorities and most

meaningful rewards in his life. Tony was a devout Catholic, praying the rosary each night. He was a true believer and a communicant of St. Mary of Mt. Carmel/Blessed Sacrament Parish.

Tony is survived by the love of his life and his “bride,” Carol; son, Anthony J. Carzo II; daughter and son-in-law, Maria A. and David M. Fanelli; grandchildren, Gianna, Giulia, and David Anthony Fanelli, each whom possess a piece of his personality; sister and brother-in-law, Mary Ann and Joseph Guzzetta; brother and sister-in-law, Frank "Cic" and Josie Carzo; and sisters-in-law, Phyllis A. Carzo, and Cynthia "Cindy" Carzo. He fondly remembered his brothers and sisters-in-law who preceded him, infant brother Joseph, Joseph J. and Marie C. Carzo, Rocco L. and Lena M. Carzo, Carmen A. Carzo, George Carzo, and Filomena “Mena” Carzo.
