



Mr. Anthony N. DeTraglia

June 27, 1941 - July 31, 2022

UTICA/FRANKFORT – Mr. Anthony N. DeTraglia, age 81, peacefully went home to the Lord on Sunday, July 31, 2022. At the time of his passing, he was in the hearts of those he loved most.

Born in Utica on June 27, 1941, to the late Salvatore J. Sr. and Mary (Izzo) DeTraglia, Anthony was a graduate of Whitesboro High School/Class of 1959. Anthony went on to enlist in the US Army during the Vietnam era, as part of the control group. He was always proud to have served his country.

At one time, Anthony had been married to the former Joan Dinardi, and to that relationship came the blessing of his two children.

His first humble work beginnings found Anthony at the former Chicago Market on Columbia St. Then, for over 30 years, Anthony was a dedicated Machinist at the Chicago–Pneumatic Tool and Dye Co. Anthony then returned to education, studying at MVCC and SUNY Polytechnic Institute, where he received his BA in Social Work. This new field of work offered both a challenge and a change of pace for Anthony, and he was fulfilled by being able to advocate for children. In his retirement, he filled his day with freestyle painting.

Anthony was an intelligent, kind, and loving man, known for spoiling his children. Moreover, he was generous and enlightening to them. His family time was so important to him—being with the next generation(s), including the nieces and nephews, was a priority.

Anthony loved to cook and could boast an extensive knowledge of numerous

cuisines. He greatly enjoyed the opportunity to please others' palates. He enjoyed hosting dinners and taking in festivities with the good companionship of the "dinner group." When not in the kitchen or with family, one could have found him spending time with friends, traveling, and seeing the sights of the United States as well as abroad. One of his favorite spots was Sylvan Beach, where Anthony often escaped to his family camp. They made many wonderful memories that are to never be forgotten, especially during the 4th of July weekend, which was a great celebration when all would come from near and far to be together.

Another favorite activity of Anthony's was downhill skiing at McCauley Mountain. When he had the "itch" to have a sports car, you could often see him perusing around town! Additionally, he was an antique vendor at numerous shops before he became a collector in his later years. He bred dogs; particularly, St. Bernards, which was a pastime of great interest to him. A man who loved his K9s, Anthony had several over the years. His dog Dante, a Goldendoodle, was his best friend and the king of the house. It is a comfort to know they are back together again.

Anthony knew the Lord and had a personal relationship with Him. He looked to God often, believing in his guidance. He was a communicant of Mary, Mother of Our Savior Parish, Lourdes Campus.

Anthony is survived by his daughter, Alyse DeTraglia and Jestine Davis; and his son, Michael DeTraglia and Michelle Minnig. He will live on in the hearts of his brother and sister-in-law, Salvatore J. Jr. and Lois DeTraglia. Anthony also leaves behind many nieces, nephews, great-nieces, great-nephews; his aunt, Evelyn Cofano; and cousins. His best friend was Steve Deery; the two spent many good times together. He was predeceased by his nephew, Todd DeTraglia.
