



Anthony P. "Tony" DiMambro

January 14, 1934 - March 19, 2013

Mr. Anthony P. "Tony" DiMambro, age 79, was carried to Heaven on Angels' wings when he peacefully passed away on Tuesday, March 19, 2013 in the comfort and dignity of his home surrounded by his family. His passing occurred on St. Joseph's Day, a Catholic Feast Day in honor of a saint to whom Anthony was deeply devoted.

Born in Utica on January 14, 1934, Anthony was the son of the late Alessandro "Sam" and Angelina (Palazzo) DiMambro. He attended St. Mary of Mt. Carmel Elementary School and T.R. Proctor High School. At age 19, Tony was drafted into the United States Army where he honorably served his country between World War II and the Korean War. On October 1, 1955 he was joined in the Sacrament of marriage to the former Genevieve Maggiolino with whom he shared 57 years; they rejoiced when they reached their 50th anniversary. As a couple, they honored their wedding vows and worked as a team to raise their family with love.

Tony retired from his position with the U.S. Postal Service after more than 30 years of loyal service. On the job, he was known for his forte of organizing the county and state mail with accuracy and speed, and he was a member of the American Postal Workers Union. Tony was a hard-working man and it was the norm for him to have a second, part-time job to assist with the needs of his family. His vocation as a self-taught carpenter allowed him to perform many household improvement projects, a talent he put his heart into. He was a selfless man, and he did whatever he could during his life to make the earth a

better place. He had the gift of giving a grey day a ray of sunshine for his family. He was a role model to his children and was their friend, listener, and teacher; through the years, he offered total love and support to his children and grandchildren. He was a member of the Whitestown American Legion Post 1113 where he enjoyed the camaraderie of his fellow affiliates. He was a big boxing fan, followed "Fighting Irish" Notre Dame football, and of course, felt a great pride for the NY Yankees. Most of all, Tony was blessed to have his wife and daughter as his caregivers, especially in the later stages of his illness. A parishioner of the Church of Our Lady of Lourdes, he was very faithful to God, and his Catholic religion formed the foundation of his life. Tony is survived by beloved wife, Genevieve; his children and their spouses, John and Jennifer DiMambro of CO, Tom and Mal DiMambro, and Geralynn and Bill Owens, all of Utica, and the cherished memory of his infant daughter, Anna Marie, who preceded him in death; his grandchildren, of whom he was so proud, Leah DiMambro; Anthony John, Brandon, Courtney, and Marissa DiMambro; and Kayla, Gina, and Anna Owens. He also leaves many nieces, nephews, great-nieces, great-nephews, cousins, and in-laws Marie DiMambro of Italy, Laurie DiMambro of FL, Maggie DiMambro, Connie Mulvihill, Diane Forte, and Helen Maggiolino, all of Utica. He was predeceased by his sisters and brothers-in-law, Mary and Tony Saponaro, and Susan and Richard Gianotti; his brothers, Mike DiMambro, Jimmy DiMambro, and Frank DiMambro; and his in-laws, Fannie and Alex Deschano, Mary and Leo Roy, Ignazio and Marion Maggiolino, Anthony Maggiolino, Donald Mulvihill, and John Forte.

The family extends appreciation to Nurse Practitioners Sally O'Callahan, and Sister Patricia for the care they rendered to Tony over the years, with dignity and compassion. Thanks also to all family and friends for their prayers and assistance; and the staff of Hospice & Palliative Care for their professional and sensitive support.
