Stephanie also enjoyed time with her two brothers, Daquan, and Joseph. Before Aiden was born she took “Baby Joe” with her everywhere she went and always playfully argued with her brother “Booka.” Brenda’s entire family cared for and loved her every moment of her life. A true warrior at heart, she acknowledged her pain and faced her challenges with courage and grace. Her strength and personality prevailed through her illness, and everyone admired her for that. She had a look which was expressive of exactly how she truly felt.

She was the kind of mother who always wanted to please her son, especially when it came to food. Fried chicken and baked beans were among his favorites. When his mother was unable, his Grandma could often be counted on to fulfill his cravings.

Stephanie found endless laughter and joy in the unique humor of Tyler Perry’s shows and movies—especially the unforgettable Madea, who never failed to bring a smile to her face. She also had a love for shopping, though her purchases were rarely for herself. Her heart was always centered on Aiden, and she shopped with his needs and desires in mind, a reflection of her selfless love as a mother.

Yearly barbecues and weekly dinners brought everyone together for great food, good company, and endless memories. Her late grandfather, John Robinson, Jr., and her late stepfather, Joseph Adams Sr., were the master chefs. Brenda treasured those memories and the cherished traditions of days past.

When she could, attending church on Sundays was how Brenda renewed her spirit for the week ahead. She prayed to the Lord for strength and hope to carry her through the pain she endured. In her earlier years, she was a member of St. James A.M.E. Church. More recently, she attended Greater Grace Church of Utica and Agape Ministries, where she found deep solace and peace in God's presence.
