Mrs. Carmella R. (Mazza) D'Agostino, age 91, of Utica, passed away on Tuesday, February 16, 2010 at the Presbyterian Home for CNY, Inc.

Born in Utica on April 3, 1918, Carmella was the daughter of the late Joseph and Mary (Graziano) Mazza. She was raised and educated locally. On June 22, 1946 she married Frank "House" D'Agostino with whom she shared 47 years until his passing on December 4, 1993.
