Mr. Carmen A. Mango, age 93, passed away on Tuesday, August 29, 2006 in Tampa, Florida.

Born in Utica on December 28, 1912, he was the son of the late Joseph and Philomena (Graziano) Mango. He was a World War II Veteran, serving with the United States Army in the European Theater.
