



Carol Marie "Kiki" Krulinski

May 10, 1955 - February 28, 2011

Carol Marie (Kiki) Krulinski, 55, passed away peacefully February 28th, 2011 at Faxton-St. Luke's Healthcare after a courageous 3 year battle with breast cancer.

She was born May 10, 1955, in Rome, NY, the daughter of Ted and Dolores (Coleman) Krulinski. It was apparent at an early age that God had given Carol the gift of exceptional musical ability, playing numerous instruments and winning many awards and accolades, especially for the piano. Upon graduation from RFA, she received a Gulf Oil Scholarship, one of only 20 awarded that year in the United States. Carol then graduated from Potsdam State and the Fashion Institute of Technology.

Carol moved to New York City after graduation from Potsdam and while a resident for 27 years held executive support positions with many international companies: Fedders Corporation, Artcarved Rings, and Campari, among others.

Survivors include her sisters Mary and husband Robert Cimbalo of Utica, who were never far from her side, and June (Curtis) Dixon of Thornton, Colorado; nieces Ona (Zack) Viola and children Santino and Natalia, Leslie (William III) Russell, Sara Dixon; nephew Santo (Brooke) Cimbalo and children Santo, Jr. and Sofia. Also surviving are several cousins and an aunt. Carol was

predeceased by her father in 1997 and by her mother in 2002.

A private memorial service and Celebration of Carol's Life will take place at a future date. There are no calling hours.
