



Catherine D. "Kay" Maggio

November 22, 1921 - July 3, 2011

Catherine D. "Kay" Maggio, age 89, of Utica, passed away on Sunday, July 3, 2011 at the Faxton-St. Luke's Healthcare Center.

Born in Utica on November 22, 1921, Catherine was the daughter of the late Arthur and Mary (Maggio) Rossi and was legally adopted by her grandparents, Donato and Gaetana (Pape) Maggio. Ms. Maggio was raised and educated locally, graduating from Proctor High School in 1939. She furthered her education at St. Lukes School of Nursing, receiving her cap as an RN in 1943. Kay began work as an operating room supervisor at County Hospital, concurrently attending night classes at Utica College. Ms. Maggio received a BS in Nursing Education with a minor in Education from Syracuse University in 1950. With the benefit of a full scholarship, Kay also earned a Master's Degree in Special Education, also from Syracuse University. She then became a special education teacher, working for over 21 years at Kemble School, retiring in 1983.

Ms. Maggio belonged to the St. Mary of Mount Carmel Choir, the Syracuse University Alumni Association and the Christ Child Society of Utica.

Kay thoroughly enjoyed the opera and pursued her passion by traveling to New York City and Europe to experience the performances of Placido Domingo, Beverly Sills and other noted artists.

Kay is survived by her nieces and nephews, Barbara Andersen of Brick, New Jersey, Philip D. Jr. and Linda "Lynn" Maggio of New Hartford, Marilyn and Chester Baryla of Utica, Peter and Marie Callari of CA, Mary May of Utica and

Linda Muraco; and many cousins. She was predeceased by her brother and sister-in-law, Philip and Rosemary Maggio; her aunts and uncles, Rose and Alphonse Callari; Michael and Catherine Doti; Michael May, and Louise May; and her nephew, Andrew Andersen.
