



## Corinne (Dellaquila) Puleo

May 21, 1925 - November 15, 2008

Mrs. Corinne (Dellaquila) Puleo, age 83, of Utica, passed away after a lengthy illness on Saturday, November 15, 2008 at the St. Elizabeth Medical Center with her loving family by her side.

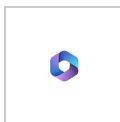
