



## Daniel S. "Dan" Valenti

December 14, 1923 - June 5, 2008

Mr. Daniel S. "Dan" Valenti, age 84, of Utica passed away on Thursday, June 5, 2008 at the Faxton-St. Luke's Healthcare Center.

Born in Utica on December 14, 1923, Daniel was the son of the late John and Immaculate (Russo) Valenti. He was raised and educated locally. A veteran of World War II and the Korean Conflict, Dan proudly served his country in the U. S. Army. He was united in marriage to the former Rosemary Liberatore with whom he shared a union blessed with love and devotion.

During his working life, Dan was employed by the Utica Department of Public Works, the position from which he retired after years of loyal service.
