



Domenica "Peggy" (Mozzetti) Loconti

May 8, 1916 - September 21, 2006

Mrs. Domenica "Peggy" (Mozzetti) Loconti, age 90, of North Utica, passed away on Thursday, September 21, 2006, at the St. Elizabeth Medical Center with her family by her side.

Born in Utica on May 8, 1916, Peggy was the daughter of the late Sabatino and Mary (Pacifico) Mozzetti. She was raised and educated locally. In 1939 she married Vito Loconti, with whom she shared a union of 61 years prior to his passing on January 16, 2001.

Peggy's priority was her family and her home. She had a boundless devotion to her grandchildren and enjoyed family functions and festivities. Her capricious character enhanced family poker games and deemed her as the 'life of the party'. She loved to dance and could be detected on the dance floor at all events. Peggy had a flair for entertaining and presenting well prepared meals for gatherings with family and friends. She also had a warm feeling for the beauty of nature and exhibited this love in her rock garden, which was accented by an array of flowers. In Peggy's later years, when her health curtailed her from cultivating her garden, Hasiba tended to it with great tenderness.

Mrs. Loconti is survived by her daughters, Vita Salerno, and Antoinette (Toni) Talerico, both of North Utica; her son and daughter-in-law, Daniel and Nanette Loconti of Utica; her grandchildren, Debra Stern, Robert J.
