



## Eddina R. (Marteen) Moore

March 2, 1918 - March 10, 2011

Mrs. Eddina R. (Marteen) Moore, age 93, formerly of Utica and currently a resident of Palatine Bridge, passed away on Thursday, March 10, 2011 at the Palatine Nursing Home. Born in Utica on March 2, 1918, Eddina was the daughter of the late Joseph and Anna Martin. She was raised and educated in Utica. In the mid 1940's she married Horace L. Moore who passed away on April 17, 2000. Throughout their more than 50 years of wedded life, the couple shared a relationship of mutual care and deep respect.

During her working life, Eddina was employed as a nurse's assistant at the Utica State Hospital. She was outgoing and sensitive to people's feelings, a personality trait that endeared her at work and at home. She was very loving and giving to family and friends, and enjoyed socializing, dancing, and singing. She was creative and skilled in arts and crafts, especially jewelry making and floral design. Eddina was a member of the North Utica American Legion Post where she was an active volunteer. She was also a volunteer at the St. Elizabeth Medical Center, and was a former communicant of St. Mary's Church on South Street.

Eddina is survived by many nieces, nephews, great-nieces, and great-nephews. She was predeceased by her brother, Arthur Martin; and her sister, Beatrice Martin.

The family is grateful to the nurses and staff of the Palatine Nursing Home for their outstanding care and devotion to Eddina.
