



## Mrs Eleanor A. (Vivenzo) Acquaviva

Mrs. Eleanor A. (Vivenzo) Acquaviva, age 78, passed away peacefully on Sunday, March 29, 2015 at the St. Elizabeth Medical Center. Upon her passing, she was in the hearts of her loved ones.

Born in Utica on July 30, 1936, Eleanor was the daughter of the late Gerald P. “Jerry” and Mary (Baleno) Vivenzo. She was a graduate of T.R. Proctor High School/Class of 1954. On October 11, 1957 she married Peter M. Acquaviva, Sr.; during their 41 year union he was a sensitive, supportive husband, and she was a hard-working, devoted wife. Together they complimented each other’s personalities. Her husband Peter passed away on May 19, 1999.

an immaculate home and was acclaimed for her artistic decorating talents. She was also impeccable in her attire and exuded great grace and style. Even in the face of physical limitations, Eleanor's strong will prevailed; she was a positive role model who inspired others by the hope and courage that guided her life.
