



Erminia Margaret "Minnie" (Mallozzi) Trino

April 13, 1929 - October 23, 2006

Mrs. Erminia Margaret "Minnie" (Mallozzi) Trino, age 77, of Utica, passed away on Monday, October 23, 2006, at the Faxton-St. Luke's Healthcare Center with the comfort of her family by her side.

Born in New York, NY on April 13, 1929, Minnie was the daughter of the late Zeferino "Jimmy" and Stella (Rosi) Mallozzi. At the age of 10 she moved to Utica, where she attended grammar school locally and graduated from T.R. Proctor High School in 1947. On May 28, 1949 she married her high school boyfriend, Anthony R. "Doc" Trino, and from that union came a daughter Edythe Denise Trino who was adored by her parents.

At one time Minnie was employed at Kemble School. She later worked at Friedlander Insurance Agency, retiring in 1993 after 18 years of loyal service. Minnie was an extremely responsible woman which enabled her to accept the roles of wife, mother, daughter, sister, aunt, and daughter-in-law with the greatest regard. She was generous of spirit, kind in her actions, perceptive of people's needs, and excelled at whatever she did.

Minnie was a seasoned cook who sang while she prepared her original dishes daily. She took pleasure in her monthly luncheon meetings with the "girls" from Proctor Class of '47. A very devoted and religious woman, Minnie had a reverence for the celebration of mass.

Mrs. Trino is survived by her loving and devoted husband Anthony "Doc"; her precious daughter, Edythe "Edey" Trino, who was not only devoted, but also her best friend; her sister, Anna M. Perritano; her special nieces and
