



Mrs. Frances N. (Greco) Benzo

December 25, 1918 - August 29, 2022

UTICA - Mrs. Frances N. (Greco) Benzo, passed away on August 29, 2022 at the Sitrin Health Care Center. Frances was 103 years and eight months old.

She was born in Utica on Christmas Day, December 25, 1918, to the late Cosmo and Julia (Palmisano) Greco. Frances was the widow of Pasquale H. "Pat" Benzo. They were married on October 5, 1940 at St. Mary of Mt. Carmel Church, Utica.

Surviving Frances are three children: MaryRose (Charles) Dzyban of Las Vegas, Nevada, Pasquale C. (Carol) Benzo of Utica, New York, and Robert C. (Bonnie) Benzo, also of Las Vegas, Nevada.
