



## Frances A. (Farda) Perry

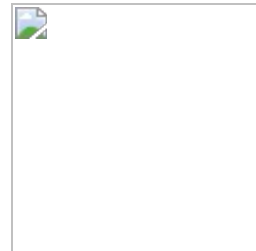

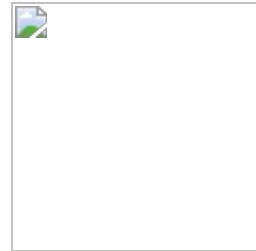

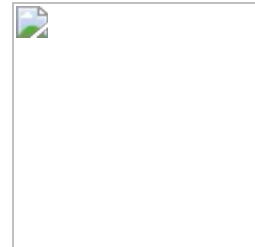
