



Mr. Frank A. Cannistra

February 25, 1930 - January 17, 2021

WHITESBORO - Mr. Frank A. Cannistra, Ret. UPD, age 90, went home to the Lord on Sunday, January 17, 2021 when he passed away unexpectedly with his wife, and grandson Dante by his side, and those he loved most in his heart. His family had the greatest admiration and love for him, and he will be sorely missed.

Born in Utica on February 25, 1930, Frank was the son of the late Vincenzo and Maria (Coschino) Cannistra. He attended St. Mary of Mt. Carmel Grammar School where he excelled in the sport of basketball and attended T.R. Proctor High School. A veteran of the United States Army, Frank honorably served his country during the Korean War as a member of the Military Police stationed stateside. On June 6, 1953, after he respectfully courted her, he married the former Angeline "Shirley" Leone and during all their 68 years together, they embraced and loved one another. They felt blessed to have each other, but as we all know, the blessing of their children made their love as a couple even stronger.

Frank worked alongside his dad as a well-known bricklayer, but he always aspired to be a policeman and member of the Utica Police Department, and in 1956, his dream to protect, defend, and respect the rights and dignity of the people he served came true. He began his career as a Patrolman and worked his way up through the ranks to Detective, and Senior Investigator. He was a champion for those who needed help, and for that, he was loved. He accrued years of experience, was admired and respected, and was proud to protect

this community for 39 1/2 years. He also worked at Chicago Market in the Deli Department, and concurrently, as with many other officers, he patrolled local events and venues. He was known to be the go-to man for advice or assistance. Chief of Police Benny Rotundo and Frank were best of friends, and the Chief, in earnest, spoke these words about his friend on the force, "If I ever needed someone to watch my back, it was Frank".

An interactive patriarch, Frank loved raising his kids and enjoying his multigenerational family. He always carved time out for each of his children and Vincent especially enjoyed one on one occasions bass fishing with his dad at Lake Moraine. It was expected that Frank's son would play baseball as well as his grandsons who followed. Papa was the chauffeur to all the grandchildren and he was always prompt. His first-born granddaughter, Nicole, held the memory of Papa driving about, showing her the homes that were decorated for Christmas, as well as the infamous Trinkaus Manor. That's how memories were made among the little ones as they grew. His grandchildren knew that he was in the audience of all the girls' performances, was a fan who attended all his grandsons' baseball and football games, and on occasion, he might try to tell the umpire that his call was wrong. He was more than attentive to the great-grandchildren's activities, and he never missed one — all out of love! Frank's family was first and foremost, always. If it was something regarding his family, it was important to him, too. Starting out as a "Pin Boy", Frank became fascinated with bowling, a sport that he managed to play until the age of 85! He was a member of leagues, upon leagues, and he rolled multiple 300 games! He was inducted into the New York State Bowling Conference (USBC) Bowling Association Hall of Fame in 2008 as well as the Utica Bowling Hall of Fame in 1984, served as president of the Utica Bowling Association and was awarded many medals in the Police Olympic Bowling Competition which he proudly displayed in his home. In the summer, he was a golfer, hitting the fairways at Valley View Golf Course, and upon a phone call, he would be a dependable substitute for any member who could not make a tournament or event for either sport. He was also fond of

friendly games of poker, and he was a lifelong fan of the New York Yankees. Frank was such a sportsman that when it came time for him to be among his nephews at the bowling alley, he was affectionately called upon as “Uncle Frank”, who gave his counsel and advice whether solicited or not!

Frank was a member of the American Legion Fort Schuyler Post, and a parishioner of St. Anthony & St. Agnes Church. The most amazing thing for Frank and Shirley was watching 3 generations of their children grow to adults who they loved and were so proud of. They were blessed with a great life filled with love, laughter, years of fun and fond memories, many friendships, and a gracious, large “Cannistra and Leone” families which could gather hundreds together at any given time. The family’s tradition for Sunday dinner was so pleasing to Frank. Shirley cooked the food, and the kids brought the dessert. They shared savory meals and glorious “green cake!”

The foundation of this entire family was the solid link between Frank and Shirley and the many beloved extended family members who made their life so meaningful for so many decades.

Amen to the old ways of keeping family together!

*From my early days as a "kid", it was Uncle Frank sitting on
Grandma's porch, usually in the glider, that he introduced us all to
baseball and the NY Yankees, not to mention the transistor radio. It

seeing him wanted to know what was going on with "the game".
Once we had that information, we left to play ball across the street,
knowing that Uncle Frank would keep us updated with game events.
Before heading over to the park, he also warned us if we didn't play
nice across the street, then we would face the wrath of Grandpa. As
if we needed to be reminded. And if it wasn't Grandpa, we would
have to face Uncle Vic or a whole line of other uncles that were
there. Never had to fear Uncle Frank, he was too far down the line.
Maybe Vinny had to when he got home, if he acted up. Wow, those
were the good ole days. Never was life so good and "pure"! Never
was tough love so "pure"! Never thought I'd be saying that. Every
once in a while, if there was a game break, he would get off the
glider, cross the street and either hit some balls or teach us about
the game, sometimes umpire. Yes, very fond memories of my Uncle
Frank.*

*In talking to Uncle Russ recently, I found out that he was a brick-
layer, a mason. I always knew his dad was, but not Uncle Frank. I
always knew him as a cop/detective who was called upon
incessantly by family members for advice or action when there was
even a slight case of impropriety or lawlessness. It was always call
Frank Cannistra/Cannistar, he'll know what to do. He'll take care of
it. Man alive, the guy had a job to do and it wasn't just taking care of
family matters. Yet, we still all called, Frank, "can you take care of*

this" or "what should we do, Frank?". I mention Cannistar, due to my older uncles didn't know how to pronounce his last name. It's Cannistra, get it right!

I saw a lot of Uncle Frank in my young adult life before I left the area to live in Rochester.

I remember him not only as a "GREAT" uncle, but a great bowler as well. I would visit the Pin-o-rama a lot to watch my uncles and cousins on Friday night bowl. I recall him, most times being the anchor man, the fifth guy on the team, the guy that was going to come through in the end. He truly loved the game. I always talked to him about the leagues he was in and the tournaments he would play in. It enticed my brother and I to join leagues and enjoy the sport. I could never master it as well as Uncle Frank or my brother. It must be in the name, I thought.

So even though I never knew my "GREAT" Uncle as a FATHER, I knew he had to be GREAT at that also. His love for his family was outspoken. They came FIRST! It was evidenced early on as Vinny was growing up and pitching/playing ball. Then again when Maria was getting married and then Sharon. A PROUD father, he was indeed. I think it was his smile that gave it away. But he also spoke very highly of them , their families and their careers whenever I saw him in church. Oh yes, you never left church without saying hello and kissing all the uncles, aunts and cousins. It started inside with all the hugging, kissing and talking and continued outside while the priests/ushers were pushing us out. That didn't stop him/us. He and Aunt Shirley continued to fill us in on what was happening with his own family. Believe me, we were in Rochester, but we weren't missing a beat on what was happening with the Cannistra family or any other family for that matter. I have to STOP, I'm ONLY allowed 4000 characters.
