



## Frank A. Sportelli

March 17, 1923 - April 11, 2010

Mr. Frank A. Sportelli, age 87, of Utica, embraced the precious moments of his life's final journey on Sunday, April 11, 2010. He passed away in the comfort and privacy of his home with the love and support of his family by his side.

Born in Utica on March 17, 1923, Frank was the son of the late Vito J. "Vic" and Palma Rose (Convertino) Sportelli. Raised and educated locally, he was a member of the first graduating class of T. R. Proctor High School in 1940. A patriot of the Greatest Generation, Frank was a veteran of the U.S. Army, serving his country in the European Theater of Operations during World War II as a member of the 28th Infantry Regiment. On September 4, 1950 he wed the former Theresa J. Martelli with whom he shared a devoted love that united their marriage of 59 years; relying upon each other for strength and support unconditionally.

Frank began his working endeavor in the grocery business while working alongside his father as they operated Vic Sportelli & Son. In 1953, he established Sportelli Super Market located at 253-255 South Street, offering specialty meats and groceries until 1962. Subsequently, he accepted a management position with Acme Markets and Price Chopper in New Hartford where he served his customers with integrity and a prime knowledge of meats. He lastly worked as an evening dispatcher for the Utica Transit Authority, retiring in 1991. Overall, he had an innate need to serve people which gave him much satisfaction. A man of simple means, Frank wore many

“hats” in his life. He was blessed with the attributes of being a good provider, a trustworthy and patient partner in life, and wonderful parent and role model. He was a gentle man with a soft heart and a strong bond with his family, home, and workplace. His generosity and goodwill will never be forgotten. He rooted for the New York Yankees and respected the sport of fishing as a generational hobby that he shared with his family. He was a member of the American Legion Post #229 and a parishioner of St. Mary of Mt. Carmel/Blessed Sacrament Parish.

Frank is survived by his wife, Theresa; and his son and daughter-in-law, Vito J. and Donna G. Sportelli of Buffalo. Always close to his heart was the memory of his son, Ralph A. Sportelli, who passed away on May 27, 1992. His legacy continues through his grandson, Patrick F. Sportelli of Buffalo. Survivors also include his nieces, nephews, great-nieces, great-nephews, cousins, and in-laws, Angela M. Paolozzi of Clinton, Ellena Snogles of Utica, and Dominick and Kathleen Martelli of Chicago. He was predeceased by his brother, Angelo D. Sportelli; his sister and brother-in-law, Vita and Joseph D. Brigano; his father-in-law and mother-in-law, Ralph and Rose Martelli; and his brothers-in-law, Joseph A. Paolozzi, Jr., and Norman H. Snogles, Jr.

The family was comforted by the professional and personal relationship shared with Frank’s physician, Dr. Scott Brehaut, who tended to Frank with so much devotion and support; his niece, Angelina Roach, whose commitment was genuine and of the greatest consolation; and the many friends who offered thoughts and prayers that were so meaningful.
