He loved listening to his music, especially classic rock as he was a guitar player, and being outdoors, taking in the beauty of the day. The earth returned the favor by allowing Gary to grow anything and everything. He was a great

gardener, especially with his tomato plants which he shared with everyone. He was also a NASCAR fan, particularly the Earnhardts and other legends, even seeing some races at Pocono. Recently, the family even drove their Monte Carlo on the Watkins Glen track. Since family gatherings were so important to him, he learned to cook from his mom's recipes, and he was really good at it! His home was a place of peace for him and it was home to many things that he built with his own hands, including a "Hotel" for his adopted cats.

Gary felt blessed to spend time with his son, and he adored his grandchildren from the moment they were born. A generous spirit and a helpful friend, he gave of himself even when he was enduring physical pain. He was loved by many and is loved even more, now.
