Mrs. Gloria C. (Chambrone) Cacozza, age 85, of Utica, passed away peacefully after an extended illness on Friday, August 28, 2009.

A lifelong Utica resident, Gloria was the youngest of four children born to Rocco and Marietta (Rockino) Chambrone. Raised and educated locally, she attended T. R. Proctor High School and the Utica School of Commerce. Before her marriage, Gloria worked for several local businesses including the Crane Company. In September of 1949, she married Albert F. Cacozza; the couple remained devoted and inseparable for 56 years until her husband's death four years ago. Gloria and Al raised two sons, Mark and Albert, Jr., both working earnestly to insure that their children received college and advanced educations, and then quietly proud when both became attorneys.
