



## Grace (Morreale) Aiello

January 24, 1918 - April 18, 2007

Mrs. Grace (Morreale) Aiello, age 89, of Utica, passed away on Wednesday, April 18, 2007, at the Charles T. Sitrin Healthcare Center with her loving family by her side.
