



## Mr. Gregory F. D'Agostino

May 22, 1952 - June 2, 2025

NEW HARTFORD – Mr. Gregory F. D'Agostino, age 73, passed away unexpectedly on Monday, June 2, 2025, with his loving family by his side.

Born in Utica on May 22, 1952, Gregory was the son of the late Frank “House” and Carmella R. (Mazza) D'Agostino. He was a graduate of T.R. Proctor High School, and continued his education, graduating from Albany College of Pharmacy in 1974. He then furthered his studies at Utica College in computer science. Gregory married Leigh Watson on April 1, 1978, and embarked on a devoted union lasting over 47 years.

A career pharmacist, Gregory began with Midnight Pharmacy in Utica, then joined the team at Randall's Pharmacy, remaining there until his retirement. He was a member of many local and state pharmacy organizations and was a current and dedicated board member of the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board, helping with the latest exam standards.

Greg possessed a quiet and gentle nature. He was keen to observe, and when he spoke, it was always in a calm, gentle, and accurate manner. A man of strong faith, Greg was an active parishioner of St. Mary of Mt.

Greg is survived by his beloved wife, Leigh; daughter, Alison D'Agostino; in-laws, Mark Hunter and Nancy Watson, and Kathy Violante; and many dear cousins and special friends, including Richard Mancini, Richard Zalewski, Robert Orilio, Ty Crandall, and Cathleen Fiore.
