



## Mrs. Helen (Rotundo) Loudis

Mrs. Helen (Rotundo) Loudis, age 79, passed away peacefully on Saturday, September 5, 2015 at the Presbyterian Home for CNY, Inc. after a long battle with Alzheimer's disease. At the time of her passing, her family was by her side.

Born in Utica on September 21, 1935, Helen was the daughter of the late Anthony and Maria (Spera) Rotundo. She was a graduate of Utica Free Academy and a proud member of the National Honor Society. 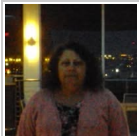
