



## Mrs. Hilda (Tagliaferri) Mardany

Mrs. Hilda (Tagliaferri) Mardany, age 82, of Utica, passed away on Wednesday, May 4, 2011 at Upstate Medical University with her loving family by her side.

Born in Rome on April 10, 1929, Hilda was the daughter of the late Cesare and Teresa (Straccamore) Tagliaferri. She was raised and educated in Rome, having graduated from Rome Free Academy. 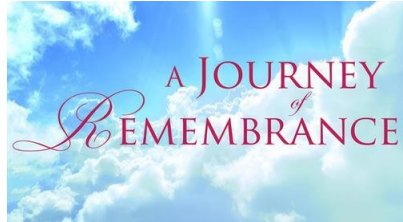
