



## Italo F. Barile

February 22, 1920 - March 22, 2010

Mr. Italo F. Barile, age 90, of Frankfort, passed away peacefully on Monday, March 22, 2010 at the Faxton-St. Luke's Healthcare Center.

Born in Ausonia, province of Frosinone, Italy on February 22, 1920, Italo was the son of the late Luigi and Maria Christina (Petronio) Barile. He was raised and educated in Italy. He served in the Italian Armed Forces during World War II where he was held as a POW, a prisoner of war.
