July 26, 1957 - December 12, 2025

UTICA – Encircled by the love of his family, Mr. James C. “Jamie” Pullman, age 68, transitioned to heaven on Friday, December 12, 2025, to be greeted by his mom and loved ones.

Born in Utica on July 26, 1957, Jamie was the son of the late James and Carmela “Millie” (Graziadei) Pullman. He attended Brandegee Elementary School and was a proud graduate of T.R. Proctor High School, Class of 1975. It was there that he formed many lifelong friendships, to which he remained close until the end. Years later, Jamie earned a Pharmaceutical Technician certificate from M.V.C.C., enhancing his professional life.

Jamie began his working years at Garro’s Pharmacy on Bleecker Street, a position he truly enjoyed and where he became well known to the customers he served. He shared a relationship of mutual respect and admiration with his employer and friend, Tony Garro, a bond Jamie valued deeply. He later spent 13 years with the United States Postal Service at Campion Road, New Hartford, serving as a carrier and exemplifying the service motto through his pride, dedication, and strong work ethic. Continuing his career in public service, Jamie accepted a position with the New York State Department of Corrections, working in the pharmacy department. True to his character, he was trusted and appreciated by his coworkers, relationships that grew into meaningful friendships. As life often brings things full circle, Jamie eventually

returned to Bleecker Street, working at Bossone's Sausage Co. He was proudly known as the best meatball roller and there is a plaque on the wall to prove it! It was a place where Jamie and his work family shared laughter and joy, and where his love for tradition and togetherness truly shined.

Jamie had a deep love for family and cherished sharing stories about the people who meant the most to him. Known for his generous nature, he would always step up to help, often before anyone even asked. A gifted cook, Jamie took pride in his Italian preparations and entertained with style, frying the meatballs as his guests arrived. He treasured the times when his family could be together, and it brought him true joy to see those moments of laughter and connection come to life.

An exceptionally kind man, Jamie lived his life with unwavering determination and quiet dignity. Through both challenges and trials, he carried himself with grace, leaving a lasting impression on everyone who had the privilege of knowing him.

Jamie was a meticulous landscaper, truly one with the earth. As generational responsibilities shifted, he lovingly took on the care of family graves, using his creativity and knowledge to plant seasonal flowers that drew admiration. At home, his own property received the same artistic attention, reflecting his perfectionist nature. This attention to detail extended to his attire. Jamie trusted his tailor, Joe Parisi, implicitly, and together they perfected every outfit. True to his style, Jamie never revealed his ensemble until the moment of the occasion, leaving friends and family delighted by his impeccable presentation.

We are often drawn to those who inspire us, and for Jamie, that person was his mom. He carried her traits and mannerisms with him throughout his life, honoring her in all that he did. As the saying goes, imitation is the sincerest form of flattery, and Jamie embodied that in the most heartfelt way.

Family was deeply important to Jamie, and he served as a tremendous inspiration to his nieces and nephews. His advice was always thoughtful and sincere, shared with warmth and wisdom, leaving them with cherished memories that will endure for a lifetime.

Jamie was a certified celebrant, officiating the weddings of his niece, nephews, and several close friends. He saw this role as a calling, guided by a deep sense of spirit and purpose. Through these moments, he became a vital part of people's celebrations, sharing in their joy and leaving a lasting impression on all who were fortunate to be included.

Faith played a central role in Jamie's life. He was originally a member of St. Agnes Church, where he served as a Eucharistic Minister. When the church closed, he found a new spiritual home at Historic Old St. John's Church, serving as a collector of offerings. Attending Mass twice a week brought him a deep sense of renewal and peace.

Jamie's motto, "Effort, Blessing, and Success," reflected both his outlook on life and the thoughtful wisdom he shared with everyone around him.

Jamie is survived by his sisters and brothers-in-law, Jacalyn "Jackie" Gazzilli (the late Guy D. 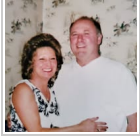
