



## Jeanette Ann (DeMarco) DeCicco

August 17, 1943 - February 4, 2024

UTICA – Jeanette Ann (DeMarco) DeCicco, age 80, unexpectedly went home to the Lord on Sunday, February 4, 2024, surrounded by close friends.

Born in Utica on August 17, 1943, Jeanette was a daughter of the late Emilio and Rose (Colucci) DeMarco. She was a graduate of T.R. Proctor High School/Class of 1961.

Jeanette's heart found its match when she met Anthony “Tony” DeCicco, and they wed on January 4, 1969. Jeanette and Anthony spent many busy years together working diligently at their marriage and careers, all while raising their beloved children. They would often unwind by dancing it out in the kitchen, as Jeanette always had the radio going. Anthony would often ask Jeanette for a “booge” which was his personal slang word for a kiss. Anthony and Jeanette shared 28 years prior to his passing in 1997.

Jeanette was employed for 30 years with Oneida National Bank, which later became Fleet Bank, and is now known as Bank of America. She never missed a day of work and enjoyed every minute of those 30 years. Jeanette was comfortable with her long-standing position, reminding her kids that she “just worked there,” she “didn’t own the place.” This would be her answer whenever her kids asked for a car!

Jeanette can be remembered as big-hearted with a contagious laugh. She was a worrywart and could often be found easing her worries with shopping sprees. After each shopping spree she would come home with “one or two” “cazzatelles” or knick-knacks, usually found in some clearance bin. In the last 5 years, if you ever saw Jeanette, she was always accompanied by her canine sidekick, Annalise. Her children understood that Annalise came first in their mother's heart. In her later years, Jeanette enjoyed special trips to the casino. Her children were immensely proud of their mother for moving to a different state to start a new life in her late 70s, never forgetting about the dear memories she made back home. Jeanette started every Monday thinking about the upcoming Sunday dinners because she knew that it meant she did not have to cook! She only had two duties at Sunday dinner, preparing the salad and indulging in the pasta.

Jeanette was devoted to her Roman Catholic faith.

Jeanette is survived by her children and their spouses, Robin Hellinger, Jim and Tracy DeCicco, Wendy and Larry Futter, Laurie Leaf, and Tony and Michelle DeCicco. She treasured the memory of her late grandson, Daniel DeCicco.
