Market on Albany St. She encompassed many responsibilities from welcoming customers, stocking orders, and all the momentum of keeping the business well cared for until the return of her husband and brother-in-law, who both held full-time jobs during the day. In 2002 her husband Ed became ill, and that changed the course of their lives. She accompanied him to all his treatments, and he

In addition, she always had the energy to entertain the members of the team after a game at their apartment where the food was plentiful and all were welcome. Joan was a very hospitable-natured woman who was passionate about her cooking and always ready to entertain. Memorable were her meatballs and bread, sausage rolls, Christmas Eve fish and her famed lasagna. Joan hosted Thanksgiving with an incredible meal and fixings, that included her famous stuffing. Not all families would know of this kind of life, but if you came from East Utica you were rooted in love, food, family and good times. Joan enjoyed hosting for the people she loved, which were many.

She was a great shopper and loved going up and down the aisles shopping for clothes. She was always stylish and it was very important to her that she was always put together, dressed in her best. She had a habit of making sure that all in her family were safe and at home. When she was raising her children, she never slept until they all had returned. Joan adored, loved, and protected her children and she was the best mom anyone could ask for! When her five grandchildren arrived, they shared the most valuable time with her. Then the two great-grandchildren proved that her motherly instincts were still intact. She was "Gram" to the first generation and "GiGi" to the greats. She tried her very best to attend all of the special events that occurred in their lives. When her granddaughter Rachel was married, she was asked to be a bridesmaid in her wedding. Joan joyously accepted and she also attended her Bachelorette Extravaganza in Atlantic City. She was the life of the party, and that is just who she was.

She married the love of her life, who became her soulmate, she knew the

hearts of her three children, as well she shared her blessings and knowledge with her grandchildren and great granddaughters. Therefore, you could appreciate the countless memories of the wonderful years.

Joan was deeply dedicated to her faith, attending Mass and receiving the Holy Eucharist was so very important to her. The family practiced their faith at St. Agnes Church and is having her Mass of Christian Burial celebrated at St. Anthony & St. Agnes Church.
