UTICA – Mr. Joaquin V. Vega, age 88, went to be with the Lord on Tuesday, October 17, 2023 in the comfort and dignity of his home with his loving family by his side.

Born on August 17, 1935, in Ponce, Puerto Rico, he was the son of the late Pascual and Vicenta (Vazquez) Vega. Raised in Puerto Rico, Joaquin later moved to the Bronx, NY in 1970 to reunite with his family. By 1985, he had made Utica his home. In 1958 he wed Sonia Pacheco, a union that was blessed with 6 children. Sonia passed away on February 7, 2001. In 2007, he found love again and wed the former Providence DiGeorge.

Joaquin worked as a carpenter and a contractor in Puerto Rico and was a jack of all trades. For a period, he ran a grocery store in Puerto Rico as well. He later served as an apartment complex superintendent in New York City.

Joaquin took on all responsibilities, however, heights were a no-go for him. He possessed a passion for music, which led him and his brothers to start a band. They had the privilege of performing with many renowned artists.

Joaquin took joy in playing the Maracas and dancing. His prowess in games of chance often resulted in a win. He loved meeting new people and having conversations. With a beautiful and generous heart, he showed kindness to all, especially his family and neighbors during harvest time for fruits and vegetables. He enjoyed a good joke and sharing laughter with others. Joaquin loved to travel, whether it be by car, plane, or train, to visit family and see new sites. He was a man of faith, making God and prayer integral parts of his daily

life. As the patriarch of 5 generations of his family, he will be remembered deeply.

Joaquin is survived by his beloved wife, Providence; his children and their loves, Joaquin, Jr. and Carol Vega, Olga and Edwin Vazquez, Victor and Sonia Vega, Magaly and Robert Pacheco, Jamie and Vicki Vega, and Carmen "Cookie" Vega.
