



John N. Carbone Jr.

July 27, 1930 - April 22, 2013

Mr. John N. Carbone, Jr., age 82, passed away on Monday, April 22, 2013 in the dignity and comfort of his home with the love and support of his wife by his side.

Born in Utica on July 27, 1930, John was the son of the late John, Sr. and Theresa (Parma) Carbone. Raised and educated locally, he attended T.R. Proctor High School. A veteran of the United States Army, John served his country with pride during the Korean Conflict, stationed in Japan and honorably discharged as a corporal. On September 15, 1951 he married his childhood sweetheart, the former Marie D. DeBernardis, and together they shared 61 years devoting their lives to each other.

John was employed at the Griffiss Air Force Base Electronic Department, retiring in 1984 after many years of steadfast service. John was an honest, humble, and God-loving family man. Although his family came first, he did his best to meet the needs of his church, the Knights of St. John, and any friends in need. He pursued due diligence and precision in all his endeavors, from participating in the game of golf in many leagues to celebrating many traditions, from Sunday dinners to holiday gatherings. He was also a Mr. Fix-It, especially in the area of woodworking. He was a charter member of the Knights of St. John Commandery #385/exalted and noble Degree of the Holy Cross and a member of the Fort Schuyler Post #1290. John was a member of St. Anthony & St. Agnes Church where he served funeral Masses for many years with a respectful presence.
