



Mr. John Robinson, Jr.

February 8, 1937 - February 18, 2021

UTICA – John Robinson, Jr. was the firstborn to the late John and Carrie (Brown) Robinson on Edisto Island, SC on February 8, 1937.

John's parents began their journey in the home of his paternal grandparents filled with love and adventure, with his mischief-maker youth along with his sibling, cousins and other family members until his family had completed building their own home nearby on the same property, and the house still stands today.

John came from a family of carpenters and farmers on both his maternal grandfather Wm. Bubberson Brown and his paternal grandfather John (Mackie) Robinson who was honest, hardworking and foremost loved God. The family holds a place in the history of Edisto Island, SC because of the contributions they made to that area. John honorably served his country during the Vietnam Era as a member of the United States Army with Battalion 509G stationed in Fort Jackson, SC

John relocated to New York City in 1958 where he lived with his Aunt and Uncle Lou and Brownie along with his cousins on 132nd Street where they enjoyed several family gatherings and house parties. John met his wife Estell Simmons at one of those family gatherings, and on March 9, 1961 they married and raised seven children together. John always had a desire to have

a full house with many children surrounding him that gave him the opportunities for many family gatherings which was very important to him. John oversaw the exciting outdoor children's activities, not only for his children but the neighborhood families and children as well.

The South Bronx is the place they choose to raise their children that also extended to nephews, nieces and others. His wife was the disciplinarian and kept things in order as he would often times sit back and watch mischief happen with a smile on his face until she appeared and in his laughter he would say "that's enough you all". He worked as a demolition specialist for most of his time in NYC as well as owning a neighbor Fish Market with his brothers-in-law Louis Simmons, Sr and John Pressley. John would do whatever it took to provide for and be able to enjoy life, for and with his family.

While in NYC he served at Ebenezer AME church in NY, NY under Rev. William M. Robinson, Sr. (his brother) in whatever capacity needed since the church began. The church gave him awards for service rendered throughout the years of him surrendering to the will of God for his life.

As their three girls ventured out and moved to Utica NY, John and Estell stepped up to higher levels to keep his family together and close knit and in 1991 they decided to move to Utica NY also. His household immediately joined St. James AME church in 1991(his wife and son Delvin LaMel on the music team, John in his true form serving in whatever capacity needed. The church was on Eagle Street in Utica when they moved from the Bronx, under Rev. Clarence Bass and Rev. Hester Dehart at that time.

He earned the title of "Father of the Church" under his present pastor, Rev. Richard Moron, Jr at St. James AME church in New York Mills as well as serving as trustee in previous years. He has served as "pillar of his parish" since 1991 with his

family by his side; he has been awarded many honors:

When his wife became ill, he was faithful to visiting her in MV Nursing Home every day for 19 years. After 51 years together, his beloved Estell passed away on August 24, 2013.

In 2012 he retired from the Birnie Bus Company as a driver for the Utica City School District after 9 years of service (as his father who also was a School bus driver on Edisto Island), John then started a career with Oneida County Meals on Wheels (where his grandchildren would work beside him in the summer as he taught them the value of hard work). He worked more after retirement than he had in the Business world, being there for his family as babysitter, home repair, chaffer, cook, comic and teacher of life as he continues to be an example of how to live a content, spirit-filled life for over 80 years.

John was a Jack of all trades and a master of none as his wife and others

would say, for his entire life with MacGyver talents. He was a whiz at adapting and improvising to solve any of life's issues! He would say "I going to beat this, this is not going to beat me, you must work on it until you find the solution." John was resourceful and always made a way. He was the original "O.G." and there will never be one to take his place.

To his generations and the ones after him, he kept it young and real. Nothing went unchallenged because of his love for his family and friends and because of his generous soul. John would cook anyone's favorite meal for Sunday dinner, or birthdays but he especially enjoyed preparing his favorite dishes: okra soup, yellow rice, shepherd's pie and hop and johns for New Year's! John also had a tendency to start a party before the party! He would even put up his own decorations. John loved to laugh at his own jokes, he was youthful and could deal with anything they put in front of him!

John's children, grands, great grands, nieces, nephews and friends were a bundle of joy to his spirit. They entertained him with dancing and singing, almost any Friday and/or Sunday evening at his home where all gathered with humor galore! Music uplifted his spirit, from contemporary old school R&B, Motown, to inspirational Gospel as it all moved his heart and soul as we sang along with the music. John strived to keep in shape by exercising with his daughters even walking around the track. Truth be told, the man wanted to have fun and stay young until the Lords' return, which he did!

John knew the true meaning of living life to the fullest as the Grace of God flowed throughout his life.

Whether you called him John, dad, pop' pop, uncle, Yhetto, Kochie, Egghead, pa pa bear or friend, you will be missed by any and all who had the pleasure of being in your presence. His life was a true example of a picture of God's unconditional love, faith and fellowship, which God tells us about, in his

favorite verse. "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." John 3:16

God reached down from heaven and retrieved the Patriarch of our family and tribe, John Robinson, Jr., age 84, from his earthly home to enter his everlasting home on Thursday, February 18, 2021 to join his sons who preceded him: John Anthony, Ervin, Gilbert "Gil", Gerard "Gee", and Delvin LaMel Robinson along with his brother James Andrew Robinson.

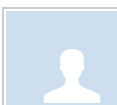
