Mr. Joseph D. Cianciolo, age 84, passed away on Friday, July 29, 2016 in the comfort of his home with his loving family at his side.

Born in Utica on January 18, 1932, Joseph was the son of the late Thomas J. and Mary L. (DeJoseph) Cianciolo, Sr. Raised and educated locally, he was a graduate of Utica Free Academy. A proud veteran of the United States Army, Joe served his country with honor as a member of the 82nd Airborne Division. On September 10, 1955 he married the former Lee Cardillo with whom he shared 56 years in a loving and committed bond prior to her passing on August 22, 2012.

For over 32 years, Joe held a position as a representative for the American Chicle Group, a division for Warner-Lambert. His ability to understand, educate, and respect his clients made him well suited for his career. As a proud patriarch, Joe loved his family and cherished the time spent with his children and grandchildren. He was a loving father, husband, grandfather, and a special friend to all. A talented carpenter and craftsman, he was a resourceful man, pleased and proud that he was able to build his beautiful home. His loved ones have fond memories of family cookouts and gatherings where Joe would take on the role of chief chef and cook. He also enjoyed traveling ventures with his family and friends. He was a handsome man and a sharp dresser and will be remembered for his style and charisma. He was also charming, kind, polite, and generous. Joe was a steadfast, strong-willed man's man, and in the end, he was an incredible fighter. He had a zest and

passion for life that prevailed until his last day.

Joseph was a member and past president of Tau Phi Zeta Fraternity in Utica, an honorary, lifelong member and 4th Degree Knight of the Knights of Columbus, Council #189, and a member of the New Hartford American Legion Post #1376. He was faithful and devoted to his Catholic creed and was a communicant of St. John the Evangelist Church.

Joseph is survived by his daughter, Deborah C. Cianciolo of Liverpool; his son and daughter-in-law, Dr. Joseph J. and Dr. Elizabeth Cianciolo of Staunton, Virginia; his grandchildren, Catherine Cianciolo, and Joseph Clayton Cianciolo; his sister, Veronica "Ronnie" Taylor of Maryland; and his brother and sister-in-law, Dr. Thomas J. and Lori Cianciolo, Jr. of Clarence, NY. 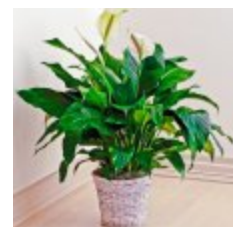
