She especially enjoyed working “St. Nick’s Night” where she distributed clothing to the needy. Close to her heart was the St. Cosmo & St. Damiano Chapel Shrine on Kossuth Ave. whose roots came from the village her mother immigrated from, here she spent many hours

maintaining the chapel and fighting to keep it perpetuated. She was a member of the MetLife Veterans Association, the American Legion Post #229 Auxiliary where she spent many happy hours with friends laughing and dancing, Woman of the Moose Chapter #142 where she spent many moments upon the dance floor with her friends, Member of I.A.M., and worked with the GED program. It was here that she became good friends with Lucretia Hunt. She also worked every election at the polls; she never missed the opportunity to be present to an election and cherished her right to vote even if her candidate did not win!

Julie loved to travel and went on many vacations with her longtime friend Rose French. She was exceptionally proud of her Italian heritage and visited the home of her parents and relatives several times.

Julie's world revolved around her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. Her love and devotion was immense and will always be cherished. Her children were her life and strength, her grandchildren were her soul and memories, and her great-grandchildren were her heart and smiles.
