January 16, 1914 - April 2, 2010

Mrs. Katherine M. (DeBartolomeo) Schiavetta, age 96, of Utica, passed away on Good Friday, April 2, 2010 at the Faxton-St. Luke's Healthcare Center with the love and support of her daughter by her side.

Born in Indianapolis, Indiana on January 16, 1914, Katherine was the daughter of the late Ross and Beatrice (Morlando) DeBartolomeo. Along with her family, she traveled to Italy where they resided for a period of time, returning to the United States and Utica at the age of 13. On June 12, 1937 she married Frank J. Schiavetta with whom she shared 48 years prior to his passing in 1984; they were truly united by a bond that was rooted in their love for their family. Through her generosity and love, holidays were made special, every birthday was celebrated, and many good memories were created. For relaxation, she enjoyed her daily practice of solving word searches. Since she lived her life in the light of

Christ's teachings, it is fitting that she would pass on the day of Our Lord's death. She was a parishioner of St. Anthony & St. Agnes Parish.

Katherine is survived by her son and daughter-in-law, Joseph A. and Diane Schiavetta of CT; and her daughter, Cathy F. Bohlen of Bath, NY; Always close to her heart was the memory of her son-in-law, John E. Bohlen, who passed away on January 3, 2001.
