



## Mr. Kenneth R. Zayas

October 30, 1951 - April 28, 2026

UTICA – Mr. Kenneth R. Zayas, age 74, went home to be with the Lord on Tuesday, April 28, 2026, surrounded by his loved ones.

Born in the Town of Sodus, NY, on October 30, 1951, Kenneth was the son of the late Manuel and Anita (Irizarry-Molina) Zayas. As a young child, he resided in Brooklyn with his family before relocating to the Utica area, where he remained a lifelong resident. His family was proud to be among the first Puerto Rican families to settle locally, and Kenneth carried on that legacy by helping many other families become established in the community. He attended Utica Free Academy.

Kenneth proudly served his country as a member of the United States Marine Corps during the Vietnam War. Following his military service, he pursued a wide range of studies at Mohawk Valley Community College, including electricity, welding, small engine repair, plumbing, HVAC, and carpentry. A Marine through and through, he carried that same discipline and determination throughout his life.

Kenneth shared a loving relationship with the late Eneida Bermudez, with whom he was blessed with two sons. He was later united in marriage with Stephanie Gutowski, and from that union came the blessing of three daughters.

Kenneth was a true jack of all trades, known for his vast knowledge and his willingness to help others. Over the years, he held positions with several local companies, including Lenox Heating, Vinny Ficci Heating and Cooling, Mid-State Sign Company, and Durante Signs, where he worked as a welder.

He was a selfless and generous man, always giving of his time and talents. A prominent member of the Latino community, he took great pride in helping others. He enjoyed dining at his favorite restaurant, Sabor Latino, where he appreciated the warmth of the staff—especially Julia—and proudly considered himself a “foodie.”

Kenneth was an avid lottery player and enjoyed the outdoors, especially fishing and camping with his loved ones. He also held a deep appreciation for his Catholic faith and enjoyed attending mass at Historic Old St. John’s Church and at St. Francis De Sales Church.

He was known for his practical nature and often reminded those around him with his familiar phrase: “Shut the lights off!”

Lovingly remembered as a devoted father, grandfather, brother, and friend, Kenneth was deeply cherished by all who knew him. He will be fondly remembered as someone who now “fishes the lakes in Heaven” alongside his beloved uncle, the late Philip Irizarry.

He is survived by his daughters, Kristy and her husband Jim Hale, Missy A. and Milton A. Argueta, and AnnMarie Zayas (Paci); and sons, Kenneth R. Zayas, and Antonio R. Zayas. Kenneth was blessed with many grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.
