



## Mrs. Lois E. (Darling) Young

June 16, 1918 - May 19, 2018

WEST FRANKFORT/UTICA - Mrs. Lois E. (Darling) Young went to be with the Lord when she passed away on Saturday, May 19, 2018 at the Masonic Care Community of NY, less than a month shy of her 100th birthday.

She was born at the family farm on Welsh Bush Road in West Frankfort, the youngest of five daughters of the late Ernest E. and Addie Jean (Sutliff) Darling.
