Mrs. Louise A. "Louise" (Audefroy) Dattuomo, age 90, of Utica, went home to be with the Lord on Monday, December 13, 2010 with the love and support of her family by her side.

Born in Paris, France on Christmas Day in 1919, Louise, whose given name was Louise Albertine, was the daughter of the late Louis and Olga (Sedru) Audefroy. She was raised and educated in Paris and held a great pride for her native country. On December 4, 1945 she was joined in marriage to John "Lefty" Dattuomo. Shortly after their marriage, Louise and Lefty immigrated to the United States and the Utica area. Their years together were focused on the blessing of their cherished children. They shared 58 years until his passing on October 17, 2004.

At one time, Louise held a position at Mele Manufacturing Company as an assembler, which was a mainstay in her life until her retirement. She developed her personality in the working world, made several dear friends, and also was enabled to make return visits to her beloved family in France. She loved her family with an enormous heart and in such special ways. Individually, she sought unique relationships with each of her children, grandchildren, as well as people who she embraced in friendship and admiration during her life. She had such a deep and passionate endearment for her family that her deep blue eyes could reflect that depth and speak volumes of her personality. She enjoyed knitting and was genuinely committed to the upkeep of her home which was so important to her. She served as the

secretary of the “French Club”, an area group of women who honored their French heritage. She was a communicant of St. Mary of Mt. Carmel/Blessed Sacrament Parish.

Louise is survived by her daughters and son-in-law, Denise Platt of FL, and Dena and Patrick Putrello of Utica with whom Louise shared a home for the past 7 months. Always close to her heart were the memories of her infant sons who preceded her in death, Jean-Claude and Dean Carmine Dattuomo. She will be remembered by her grandchildren, Devin Platt, and his father Jay Platt, Ryan and Colleen Putrello, Ciara and David Parrish, and Eric Putrello and his companion, Rachael Campese; and her great-grandchildren, Nina, Caitlin, and Connor. Louise was the eldest of 6 siblings, all of whom reside in France. Survivors also include her many nieces, nephews, great-nieces, great-nephews, cousins, in-laws, and her longtime friend, Lily Hughes who was her “French Connection”.
