August 13, 1926 - January 12, 2010

Mrs. Luba (Dubyna) But, age 83, formerly of Willow Lane in Frankfort for over fifty years, passed away peacefully on Tuesday, January 12, 2010 at the Masonic Care Community of NY with her loving family by her side.

Born in the Ukraine on August 13, 1926, Luba was the daughter of the late Prokip and Ewdokia (Lytus) Dubyna. Raised and educated in the Ukraine, she emigrated to Germany during World War II where she resided prior to relocating to the United States in 1950. In September of 1943, in the Ukraine, she married Mykola But, with whom she shared 30 years until his passing on January 12, 1974; the couple shared an enduring relationship built on a solid foundation of mutual respect and love.

Luba possessed a strong work ethic that served her well during her many years of employment at the General Electric Company on Broad Street in the assembly department. She subsequently worked in the cafeteria at M.V.C.C., retiring in 2000. Her family and those who knew her will remember her warm generosity and the happiness she found in making her home a welcome place to all. In her leisure time, she found enjoyment in crocheting afghans, which were handcrafted and treasured works of art. She also found pleasure in gardening, and in more recent years, derived solace in reading spiritual books. As a person deeply devoted to her religious beliefs and spirituality, Luba lived her life in accordance with her Christian values. She was a member of the Tabernacle Baptist Church.
