



Lucy Marie (Pavia) DeSalvo

December 1, 1917 - December 18, 2006

Mrs. Lucy Marie (Pavia) DeSalvo, age 89, of Utica, passed away on Monday, December 18, 2006, at Chilton Memorial Hospital in New Jersey, following a brief illness.

Born in Utica on December 1, 1917, Lucy was the daughter of the late Carmen Charles and Rose (Altieri) Pavia. She was raised and educated locally. On September 11, 1937 she married Nicholas B.
