Margaret's greatest joy was being a mother, followed by becoming a grandmother. Margaret gave

everything she had to offer to her family, loving unconditionally and praying her rosary daily for each of them until her last day.

Margaret enjoyed reading mystery, history, and religious books. She loved to watch the New York Yankees and followed them throughout the season, in addition to watching EWTN. Blessed with intelligence and wisdom, Margaret kept abreast of current events and remained sympathetic to the tragedies of this world.

Margaret loved the outdoors, especially the Adirondacks, where everlasting memories were created for her, her children, and grandchildren. Margaret enjoyed traveling and would visit family in Michigan and North Carolina, take bus trips, in addition to vacationing in Hawaii, Alaska, and Florida. One of her proudest and most memorable experiences was her trip to Rome, Italy to see Pope John Paul II and her two religious journeys to Medjugorje. These pilgrimages were made because of her strong connection to her faith and the Blessed Mother.

Margaret was a devout Catholic and drew strength from her faith and its teachings. She was actively involved in the church as a Eucharistic Minister, participant in Perpetual Adoration, and consistently supported international missionary work.
