Marguerite Curcio, age 73, of Utica, passed away on Monday, February 15, 2010 at the St. Luke's Home.

Born in Utica on August 21, 1936, Marguerite was the daughter of the late Samuel and Lena (Rodio) Curcio. Raised and educated locally, she graduated in 1954 from Utica Catholic Academy.

Marguerite was employed by the State of New York in a clerical capacity, the position from which she retired. At one time she organized and directed musical reviews, the profits of which benefited local charities. During this period of her life, she also participated in many church-sponsored social and outreach activities. The friendships she formed from her community and religious involvement were an important part of her life. As of late, Marguerite took pleasure in reading mystery books, and enjoyed her "role" as the unofficial greeter for the St. Luke's Home. She was a parishioner of St. Mary of Mt. Carmel/Blessed Sacrament Parish.

Marguerite was predeceased by her brother, Paul Curcio. She is survived by her sister-in-law, Doris; her two nephews and their families; and her cousins. She was blessed with the friendship and concern of her special godchild, Joey Coffay, and members of the Loran, Giuliano, and Coffay families; and Pat Bogan.

As life situations for Marguerite had changed and her needs required the care of the St. Luke's Home, she developed a genuine closeness and appreciation for the entire staff. They were her extended family and her life line. For all of

their concern, may they be blessed, and know how much she appreciated their compassion.

In keeping with Marguerite's wishes, there will be no public visitation.
